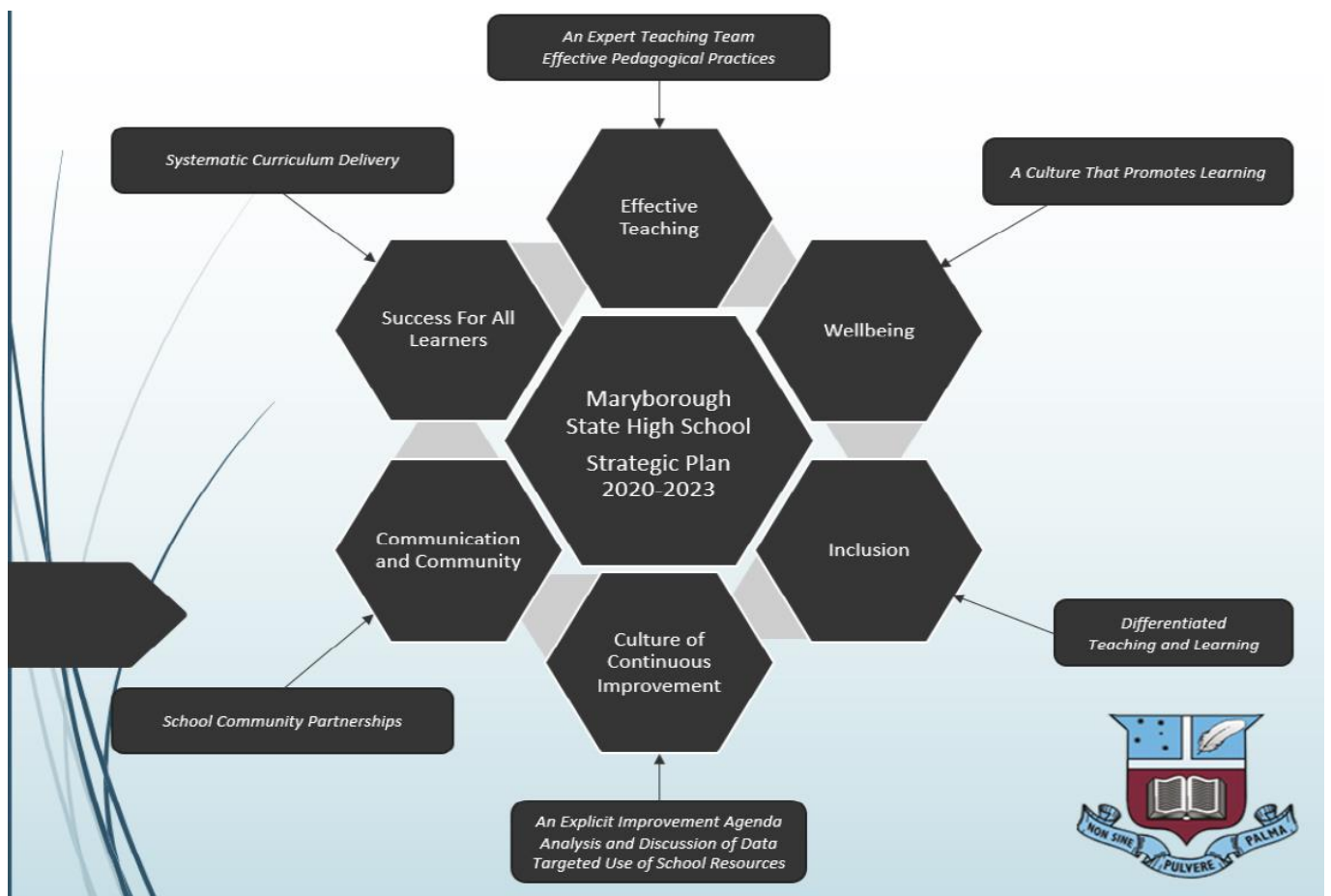
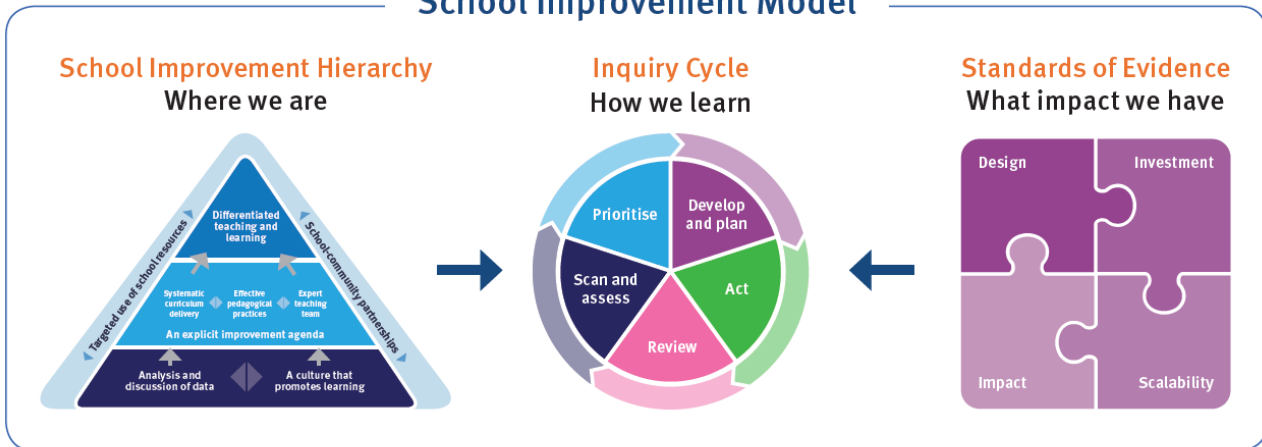

This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentages of students receiving A-C in Mathematics, Science and English for Year 7-10 to greater than 80%
- Increase school student attendance to greater than 90%
- Maintain results of Numeracy and Reading at equal to or greater than similar Queensland Schools
- Improve the teaching of reading in a differentiated manner their targeted intervention and extra support in classrooms
- Maintain 100% of students attaining a Queensland Certificate of Education by the end of Year 12
- Improve Upper 2 Band results for students in Year 7 and 9 NAPLAN testing in all strands
- Continue to develop the confidence of the Fraser Coast Community in State Education
- Develop targeted strategies for the betterment of student and staff wellbeing, including strategies for disengaged students
- Improve capacity for innovative methods for curriculum engagement in 21st Century Skills and pedagogies
- Make school and student Wellbeing a priority and a precursor for learning in all areas of school culture

Our initiatives include

- Employ and train teacher aides in reading comprehension strategies in Year 7 – 9 Literacy.
- Engage attendance officer to monitor and implement strategies for improved attendance.
- Engage Youth Support Coordinator to assist in strategies for disengaged students.
- Investing in the school Wellbeing program through provision of extra personnel.
- Provide improvements to the school physical environment to engage learners and bolster confidence in public education.
- Invest in technology services and infrastructure to improve the usage of digital pedagogy in the classroom.
- Engagement of teacher aides to assist in proactive strategies to maximise the learning environment for all students.
- Increase in capacity around Information Communication Technologies and support for students in Bring Your Own Device Program (BYOx)


